What Happened to My Stuff?

You dropped off loads of wonderful stuff for the DCHS Rummage Sale. Do you ever wonder: "where did it all go?" When I am working as a sale cashier, customers often explain how they plan to use their purchases. Besides buying for their own families, customers often "pay it forward." Here are a few examples from our Fall 2018 sale:

- One woman purchased quilt batting material on Friday. She and her friend planned to meet on Saturday to make dolls for Haiti using the batting.
- One couple purchased life preservers they will place in the containers at public docks. The preservers are for anyone who needs one while on the water.
- Someone bought boxes of books they distribute to the many Little Free Libraries around town.
- A nurses' aide from a local facility explained that residents often have only \$45 per month to spend on personal items. "Once you pay to get your hair done, you have almost nothing left," she explained, "so we started a 'store' at our facility so people can get what they need for very little money." She selected many items at the sale; she will donate them to the "store."
- Another person bought a large box of toys that will be donated to a day care.
- Several church members bought sheets to use as backing for quilts they make for needy people.

Many customers buy items they "upcycle" - making something new from something old. Some people purchase materials from which they create art pieces. Many brand new items (with tags still attached) become holiday gifts. And some folks are delighted to find the missing lid from a casserole dish, a replacement pot for their coffee machine, a matching piece of dishware or another attachment for their vacuum cleaner.

We cannot thank you enough for the many items we receive—and we hope you still have a closet or two to clean out for our spring sale (April 26-27, 2019)!




