Winter Wonderland: Keeping your Pets Safe in this Beautiful Season (by Kim Gerth)

Winter in western Wisconsin can be beautiful and fun! Fresh fallen snow can make the world appear as a winter wonderland; however, there are hidden dangers for our 4-legged friends as well as us. Ice covered sidewalks, chemicals scattered in our driveways and walkways. These can present dangers to our pets. Chemicals that melt ice or simply help our human feet grip the ground can irritate our dog's and cat's skin and get into small abrasions on their paws. If they then lick their paws, they run the risk of ingesting these chemicals, which can cause stomach and intestinal problems. There are pet friendly products out there that are relatively safe for animals; but remember you may be aware and use those products, but not everyone does! Therefore it is a good idea to make a habit of checking your dog's or cat's feet on a regular basis after they come in from outside; to be sure their paws are free from abrasions and to wipe clean any nasty chemical residue.

Our pets may not complain about the cold and probably have a blast playing in the snow...but, just like us, animals don't always know that their skin may be running the risk of frost bite! As a body's temperature decreases in response to the outdoor temperature, blood is diverted to the body's core systems, leaving the skin at risk of freezing. Skin that has been frozen will have a burning feeling in the affected area. Areas at highest risk for frost bite would be our pet's paws, nose, ear tips, and tails. Early signs of frostbite include pale, hard skin that remains very cold even after being inside. Never apply direct heat, water or otherwise, to the affected skin. Only tepid to warm water should be used or a non-electric blanket as a cover. Always consult your veterinarian if you're concerned the condition may be severe.

Winter pet concerns don't only apply to the chilly outdoors. Indoor winter plants like holly and mistletoe, even our festive Christmas tree, pose a potential danger to our pets. Holly and mistletoe have a greater toxicity level than a well know danger...the poinsettia plant! In addition to symptoms such as vomiting, diarrhea, excessive drooling, and abdominal pain from ingesting these plants; the oils produced by fir trees (common Christmas tree) can irritate our pet's mouth and stomach, while swallowing the needles may cause intestinal obstructions or punctures. The danger doesn't stop there...if your pets are like a couple of mine, they will drink the water from the tree stand. This water can contain bacteria, molds, and fertilizers which may cause your pet to become extremely sick with only a few laps! If your dogs or cats do manage to ingest any parts of these winter beauties; call your veterinarian or pet poison helpline (1-844-685-9184) to find out what you should do to minimize the potential damage.

Being aware of potential dangers to our pets during the cold weather season will assure that we can truly enjoy both our pets and this beautiful season we call winter.

A New Chapter

As I walk in to the shelter, I almost don't recognize it. What used to be the front door is now a window. The new front door is part of the new vestibule area. As you walk into the 'old' shelter, you're standing in our new lobby, which a few short weeks ago, served as the office for Jamie and myself. Our 'main' cat room no longer has cats in it...or walls! It is in the middle of becoming the new office. In the new lobby (which is twice as large as the old one), there is a room where potential adopters can meet with dogs and/or complete their adoption applications in privacy. Now what I'm describing so far is just what has happened to the old part of the shelter! On the western wall of the existing shelter, nearly 1,400 square feet of additional space has been created. This includes multiple cat socialization rooms where potential adopters and volunteers will be able to visit with a cat at length and in comfort. There are also two cat colony rooms where some of our residents will be able to stay with us cage-free, until they find their forever home. And all of these new rooms, pale in comparison to the expansive space we'll have for our feline friends in the new, vaulted-ceiling main area of the addition.

Can you tell I'm a little excited? Well I certainly am and I know many of you are as well. This expansion has been a long time coming and many of you have poured your financial and moral support into the project right along with us. We're so appreciative of that and with the end in sight, we look forward to a new chapter in our Society's history. One where we will have adequate space to better serve our residents. This is all thanks to you!

As of this writing, I don't have a final date of completion, but we are planning on having an open house in a few months. Keep a look out for more information on this, as we'd love to have you come out and see what you have helped build. (See pictures of the progress on page 7)

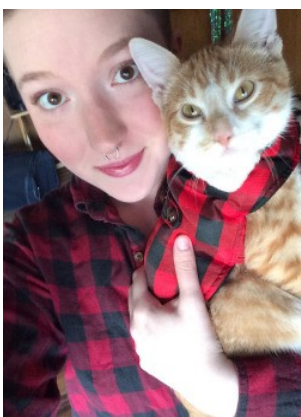
We could use your help!

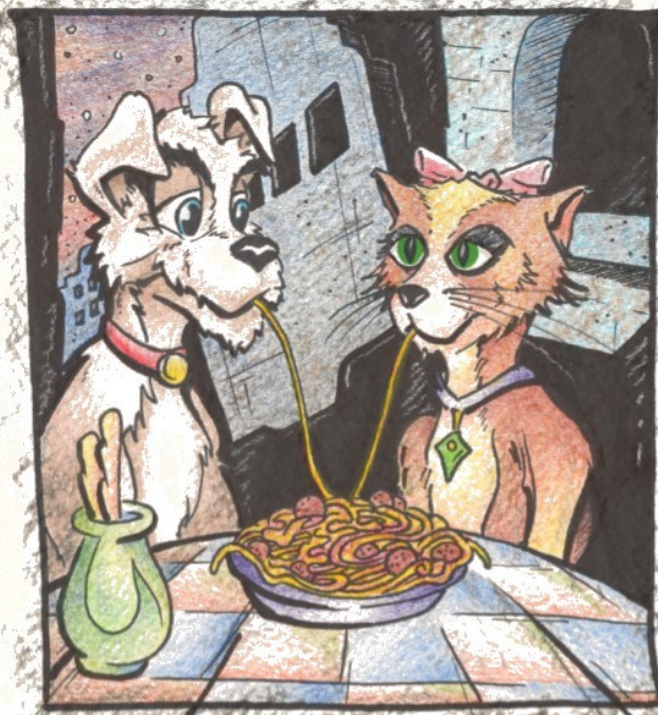

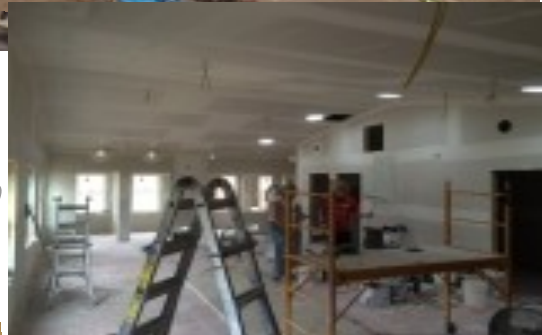
