Finally retired, a milestone in life attained, I found myself having the free time to do something enjoyable, worthwhile, and rewarding. And, with family all living out of state preventing me from enjoying my kids and grandkids regularly, I wanted to "get involved" where I may be needed.

What was my next interest and passion? That was easy. I love animals.

I had monetarily supported the shelter for years but could I actually volunteer without feeling uneasy at seeing the cats and dogs in cages and kennels while they await their fur ever homes? Could I volunteer without feeling I needed to bring every animal home?

YOU BET I CAN! Volunteering at the shelter has been the most rewarding experience I've encountered. For over two years I've treated volunteering like a scheduled activity, averaging two visits per week, and since I'm there so regularly, have gotten to know the animals and staff rather well. I rejoice with them when an animal finds their fur ever home, as well as mourn with them, too, when occasionally a situation arises that we cannot predict or avoid. And for the last six months, I'm honored to be making the follow-up adoption calls to check on our "adoptees" that we've placed into permanent homes!

The hardworking staff keeps the kennels and cages so immaculate it's impossible to feel sorry for our dear animals as they await that special person or family to fall in love with them. And the staff is so dedicated to finding just the right home for each animal in our care; no possible stone is left unturned. I don't feel I'm their only hope if I can't bring them all home.

Volunteering at the shelter has also led to my volunteering at fundraising events as well; offering whatever help that is needed. Without multiple fundraisers per year, the shelter is not sustainable, and it requires so many volunteers to pull off an event - we seldom have enough. It has aligned me, however, with persons exuding the same passion and interests as we work together to support the shelter and our goal of improving the lives of companion animals in our community.

And volunteering at the shelter has encouraged me to become a member of the Board of Directors, an ultimate responsibility in our cause of finding permanent and loving, adoptive homes for the animals in our care. The exciting highlight of our year of decision making culminated with the February opening of the new cat addition and the remodel of the original shelter. What an extraordinary opportunity! The many hours

A New Chapter

We are so glad that so many of you could join us for the open house and share in the excitement of *finally* being done with this building project. I know many of us here were overwhelmed by the moment and I know it will stay in our memories for many years to come. Thank you for sharing this with us and thank you all again for being so supportive and generous with your time and money as we looked to get this project complete.

Now that it is over, I'm happy to share there are still many exciting things on the horizon for the DCHS. First and foremost is a new program called "Pets for Seniors & Vets". This program is an adoption discount to help and encourage seniors (aged 65 or older) and military veterans (active, retired, or honorably discharged) to adopt companion animals. A \$50 discount is applied to up to one adoption per year. This is all thanks \$1,000 from the Walmart Community Fund and \$2,000 from the Menomonie Lion's Club. The generosity of these two organizations will help subsidize adoptions for these groups for years to come.

We're also working on grants for several other programs, including a low-cost spay-neuter program for bully breed owners. As you may know, many of the intact dogs that come to the shelter and go unclaimed are bully breeds (i.e. pitbulls, American Staffordshire Terriers, bulldogs, etc.). They tend to sit here for a long time due to negative stigma, difficulty of adopters getting insured and/or breed restrictions in their hometown. Hopefully we can get this program funded and help cut down on the population of these breeds in our area - not because we don't like them, but because there are too many that have no homes.

There are many different initiatives like these programs that we're working on more on them as things develop. Take care and if you missed the open house, stop in anytime for a tour!

The Dunn County Humane Society (DCHS) is dedicated to improving the lives of companion animals in our community and finding permanent and loving adoptive homes for the animals in our care. DCHS promotes the humane treatment of animals and operates as a no-kill facility, a philosophy that has been with the organization from the beginning. We do not forfeit the life of one animal to make space for another. All incoming animals are evaluated, medically treated and rehabilitated when possible. DCHS is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization that relies on the good will and generosity of individuals and corporations.

We will be participating in Kare 11's "Clear the Shelters" initiative this year. On Saturday, July 23, we will be open from 10 am to 5 pm and any adoption application submitted that day will be eligible for a reduced-fee adoption! Cat adoption fees will be reduced to \$50 and the dog adoption fees will be reduced to \$75. This is an effort by Kare 11 and their partner stations to help reduce the number of homeless animals in our communities. Last year this event helped nearly 20,000 animals nationwide find homes. In the coming weeks you will start seeing information about our participation on Kare 11.
